This year we have welcomed Chris Trubshaw and Liz Stanger to fill vacancies left by those that stepped down at the last election as well as Tom Newman, a long serving councillor who said goodbye more recently to allow him to focus on family life.

The speed indicator device or SID is now being run by Sherwood Elcock and the Speed Watch team. The occurrence of speeding is relatively low in the two locations the SID has been in over the past few months.

Project wise, we have put new street signs up (Odstock Road, Whitsbury Road and Rose Lane) and have the defibrillator ready for installation at the Radnor Arms. We will get the second defibrillator at the Yew Tree later this year.

We have also started a few initiatives to brighten up the parish, providing funds for some brighter planting at Vicarage Gardens and organising a clear up of the Jubilee Gardens area. A huge thank you to those involved in both of these initiatives.
